CHRISTOPHER HYER, DPM — CHAIRMAN

Dr. Hyer is a fellowship trained foot and ankle surgeon and partner at The Orthopedic Foot and Ankle Center, Westerville, Ohio. This is a unique foot and ankle specialty practice comprised of fellowship-trained MD, DO and DPM foot and ankle surgeons and where Dr. Hyer is Co-director of the Advanced Foot and Ankle Reconstruction Fellowship. Dr. Hyer is also the residency director of the Grant Medical Center Podiatric surgery residency. Dr. Hyer is a very active regional, national and international speaker on foot and ankle reconstruction, orthobiologics and bone marrow aspirate, foot and ankle trauma, total ankle replacement and charcot foot salvage. Dr. Hyer is a dedicated researcher with over 125 peer reviewed published articles in addition to multiple textbook chapters, technique papers and coeditor of the Primary and Revision Total Ankle Replacement Textbook.
